The first session on 17th August 2022 was handled by Heartfulness Institute, a non-profitable global organisation, for mental wellbeing and balanced lifestyle. A team of four members promoted easy ways of scientifically proven Relaxation techniques aided with guided meditation.

The second session on 26th August 2022 was on Stress Management again handled by Heartfulness team. The session brought to our students a wide spectrum of techniques to manage stress, anxiety and maintain an overall well-being.

Following this the remaining classes during the semester were handled by a team of teaching staff. Students were divided into small groups and a teacher was assigned to each of these groups. The classes aimed at helping students understand themselves, become self-sufficient in making realistic and positive selections and grow in human relationships. Discussion on values focused on student's acquiring positive attitudes and values to become dynamic members of societies.

On 27th October 2022, a team of activists from Worldwide Veterinary Service addressed the students on animal welfare and latest skills and supplies to vets and animal lovers. The talk aimed at improving health and care of animals with special attention to eradication of rabies.

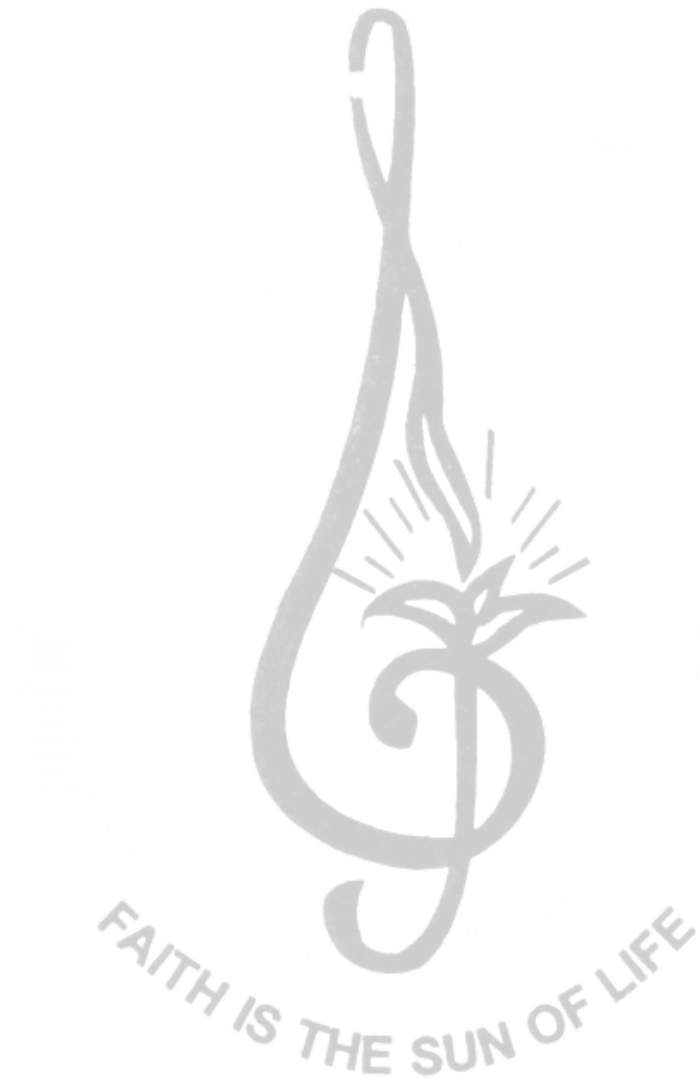

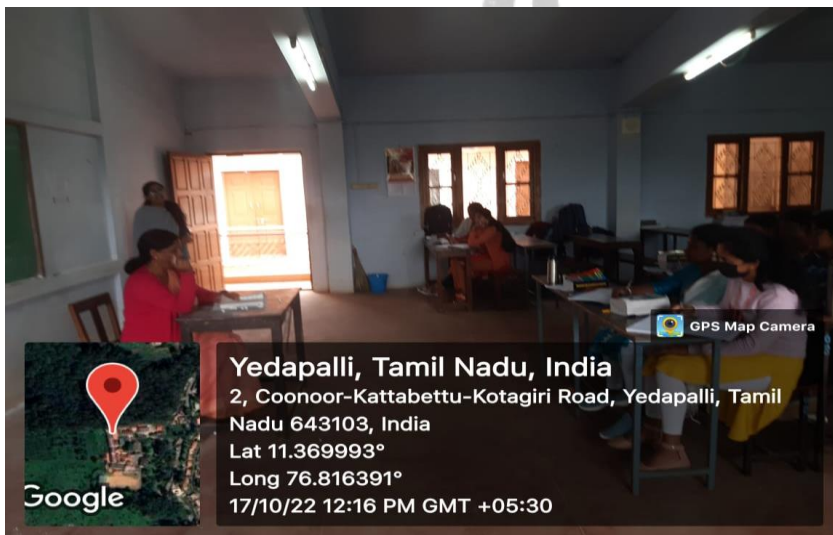
1. Number Systems

ODD SEMESTER

Communication Skill Development classes for the students of first year was conducted for 7 days in the month of July 2022. Assistant professors from the department of English conducted the course, assisted by few other teachers from the department of Botany, Mathematics, Computer Applications and History. The teachers guided and helped the students to enhance their communication skills – both oral and written. As a result of positive feedback from students, the course was later extended to the full academic year as an extracurricular skills-development programme, and the session was during the regular working hours from 11.30 am to 12. 30 pm, every alternative week in a month to enhance their communication skills.

As students were from different levels of English knowledge, they were taught the basic English alphabet and continued with 2 letters, 3 letters 4 and 5 letters words for few classes and simultaneously continued with speaking exercise using those words.

Types of sentences, parts of speech, articles, self-introduction, describing a friend and place, directions, parts of a body, vegetables, fruits, family tree were taught each week. Each word from the above topics were used to make sentences of their own.

The follow up classes were practical oriented and focussed on the essential parts of English, including the most common phrases, idioms, expressions and sentence patterns that are often used in daily life, to achieve conversational fluency much faster.

Students developed their conversation skills and were able to communicate to some extent in real life situation after these sessions.
