IQAC Initiatives

Establishment of "Providence Skill Development Centre"

Providence Skill Development Centre empowers students with the ability to support and sustain themselves and their families. Skill development is the modern way of life. Each one is bestowed with different skills and talents and certificate courses for students in their own field of interest is an added asset to build their future. Providence Skill Development Centre provides various courses to enrich the curriculum (value-added courses) and to enhance self-employment and entrepreneurship skill (certificate courses). Students have to complete one course per year. At the end of the graduate programme each student will pass with a minimum of three certificates in hand. These valueadded courses help our women students to become entrepreneurs and start a business for themselves.



WEBSITE RESTRUCTURED

The unexpected pandemic situation adversely affected the regular pace of work in the institution and now as a post-Covid venture, the College website restructuring is completed and effective in use.



NIRF PARTICIPATION

The College attempted to participate for the National Institute Ranking Framework (NIRF) for India 2021 and the required data is submitted in the NIRF portal and registered on the **8th of February 2022** even as we await its ranking.

AQAR DATA SUBMISSION

The AQAR data of the College was submitted in the NAAC portal on the 7th of March 2022 in the order of its qualitative metrics and its criteria.

AAISHE SURVEY AND ARIIA SUBMISSION

All India Survey of Higher Education (AISHE) was submitted earlier on 15.2.2022 and we received their certificate.

ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE INTERNAL AUDIT

Academic and Administrative Internal Audit was conducted for the academic year 2021-22 on 16.06.2022 and 17.06.2022 and the follow up for rectification was done on 22.09.2022.





ONLINE FEEDBACK WAS INITIATED

The IQAC of the College has systemized all online modes of feedback forms to be collected from students, staff, parents and alumni and now all reports, forms and proofs can be consolidated and automated online.

AUTONOMOUS GOVERNANCE

The College reached this milestone in March 2021 and strides forward to excel in academia and research. This is one of the salient features of the strategic planning of this Institution.

ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council governs the Board of Studies to implement innovative skill-based and locale need-based curriculum and add-on courses. Outcome Based Education (OBE) is adopted by the institution and training in this regard is given to the faculty as well. The College Library and its function also is overseen by the Academic Council and the number of books added to the library during the year 2021 - 22 was 1084.

The CoE Section

The Controller Section sees to the efficient conduct of internal examination, attendance, results and marks sheets which are all automated. The CoE has the credit of announcing the exam results along with the marks within fifteen days after the conduct of the last exam.

STUDENT COUNCIL ELECTION

There are four elected Student Council members and they take up the officiating roles of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Joint Secretary respectively. The office bearers of the Council take the help of select directors and together they are responsible for various duties in the smooth functioning of the College.



FACULTY INDUCTION PROGRAMME

The College assists and aids its staff for various induction programmes with regard to academic grants to fund projects, financial help for the IAE (Hyderabad) seminar and workshops. On-duty privileges and financial assistance are given to benefit from the above said programmes. Self-financing staff who complete their doctoral studies are offered a special incentive along with their salary. The institution helped the staff to attend the NIRF Seminar also.

CERTIFICATE COURSES

Certificate Courses for all UG students were introduced in 2021-22 under the decentralization scheme called Providence Skill Development Centre. THE READING CLUB BRIDGES GEO-POLITICAL REMOTENESS




THE MONDAY MAGAZINE INFORMS ON GLOBAL AND SOCIAL ISSUES

Since the College campus has an indoor vermicompost unit, the teaching and learning process in this unit was very successful. Once every three months the final product is processed for sale. The sales and accounts are efficiently managed. Although the course is taught and coordinated by the professors of the respective departments, the actual achievement is the result of the effort of students and their dedication towards vermicomposting. The sale amount till date includes consultancy too.
