

The Staff incharge of Placement, Dr. C Josephine Gladys and Director of placement, Sharon Monica R (III BSc Botany) had conducted the above mentioned initiative to help students to get placed in a company or a school. Through the guidance hours [every Monday 3rdhour] students were taught about the general criteria of Placement. Orientation programmes were also brought during the college hours, where internships and skill development training centres were invited which helped students learn more about the system patterns of working and improve their skill ability in various form of study. Internship programmes were also brought into importance, as students experienced exposure and learnt a higher form of education in their respective field of study. Finally, the college has placed 13 students from Department of Economics, 16 students from Department of History ,55 students from Department of English, 25 students from Department of Mathematics, 9 students from Department of Botany, 74 from Department of Commerce, 38 from Department of Computer Applications creating 72% placement during the year 2022-2023.
















Count of 1. Curriculum is structured and suitable for the desired program outcome.


Count of 2. The study program has a sufficient number of optional courses.








