REPORT OF THE TRIBAL VILLAGE ADOPTION

KOTTATI

2017-2018

To create Tribal awareness and inculcate student's responsibilities to the immediate neighborhood, a group of the final year UG students were taken to Kottatti, near Gudalur, a Paniya village. They were accompanied by Dr. Annie Christi & Dr. K. Karuppai on 26th January, 2018. After flag hoisting, sports were conducted for the school children and the village people.

On 26th January, 2018, we have given a proposal to the Block Development Officer, Nilakottai Panchayat in Panchayat Grama Sabha to construct houses for the Paniya, in Ododamvayal. As a first step to the Digital India Program of Government, our students created an awareness regarding Swayam and National Digital library in tribal village, Kottati.

As a second phase of our tribal village adoption, a group of III B.Sc Maths students were taken to Kottatti on 10th March, 2018, accompanied by Dr. Annie Christi and Dr. Karuppai. Students did a small survey to know about their food habits, festival, occupation and their needs. The Block Development Officer also accompanied us in collecting information like Ration card and Aadhar Card.

Village adoption report 2017-18

Department of History

As a part of Village adoption service, The providence college for women, Coonoor, the department of history and women studies centre and the department of commerce took an alcoholic survey on Pillur mattam village on August 15, 2017. The survey was included for 150 houses. The questionnaire was prepared on the basis of how many of them went for treatment through CHIDSA and how many of them gave up drinking after the awareness programme and how many of them are still in a want of the treatment, and counselling.

As a part of village adoption services, The Providence college for women Coonoor, The department of history and women studies centre and the department of commerce showed a video programme on 26-1-2018 to the villagers of Pillur mattam on how the Alcohol damages

the whole human body and brain, how it is collapsing the family atmosphere, losing their respect and personality in the society. People were requested that still if they want to give up Alcohol drinking they were guided to for treatment and counselling. Under SWAYAM, the DIGITAL ACTION PLAN, the people of Pillur mattam village were taught to use PAY TM, recharges, cash paying, ticket booking through mobile phones. So the people were taught to download certain apps. The people were very much eager to know about it.
